Mollusks




Mollusks are a phylum of squishy bodied invertebrates (no bones on the inside) with a soft covering called a mantle, and is sometimes protected by shells.

Oysters are bivalves, which have two shells connected by a hinge, and have no heads. They live in fresh and salt water.





Snails are
gastropods,
which have one
shell on top
(except for
slugs) and
walk on their
foot. They can
live on land
or in fresh or
salt water.

The octopus is a cephalopod, which has a distinct head, a relatively large brain and tentacles. Most have good vision and the ability to shoot out ink for protection.
